

A Quick Overview of How God Speaks to His People

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5. Through Angels

- **Examples:**
 - Gabriel announced the births of John the Baptist and Jesus (Luke 1).
 - An angel gave guidance to Philip (Acts 8:26).
 - Angels are messengers who carry out God's instructions and bring His word to His people.
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6. Through Dreams

- **Examples:**
 - Joseph received dreams that revealed God's plans (Genesis 37; Matthew 1–2).
 - Gideon received confirmation of victory through a dream (Judges 7:13–15).
 - Dreams are a common biblical avenue for divine direction, warning, and encouragement.
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7. Through Visions

- **Examples:**

- Isaiah saw the Lord on His throne (Isaiah 6).
 - Paul saw visions of Jesus and heavenly realities (Acts 9:10–12; 2 Corinthians 12:1–4).
 - Visions provide prophetic insight into God's plans or spiritual realities.
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8. Through Discernment

- **Scriptural Basis:** “But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil” (Hebrews 5:14).
 - God sharpens the spiritual senses of His people to recognize truth, error, and His direction.
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9. Through Creation

- **Scriptural Basis:** “For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—His eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen” (Romans 1:20).
 - The beauty, order, and majesty of creation testify of God's character and presence.
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10. Through Numbers

- Throughout the Bible, numbers carry symbolic meaning (e.g., 7 for perfection, 40 for testing, 12 for government).
 - God can use patterns of numbers to highlight His purposes or get our attention.
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11. Through Impressions (Inner Promptings)

- The Holy Spirit often nudges the heart with impressions, convictions, or an inner knowing (Acts 16:6–7).
 - These promptings must be tested against Scripture and discerned carefully.
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12. Through the Gift of Prophecy

- **Scriptural Basis:** “But the one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging and comfort” (1 Corinthians 14:3).
 - Prophecy provides direct revelation from God to edify, guide, or warn His people.
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13. Through Circumstances (Open and Closed Doors)

- God can guide by orchestrating opportunities or hindrances.
 - **Example:** Paul was prevented by the Holy Spirit from entering certain regions (Acts 16:6–10).
 - Circumstances must be weighed carefully in prayer and confirmed by Scripture and wise counsel.

- **Through Wise Counsel** (Proverbs 11:14).
- **Through Songs, Worship, and Prayer** (Colossians 3:16).
- **Through the Inner Witness of the Spirit** (Romans 8:16).
